**HEALTH:** You can help us promote healthy eating and physical activity, expand access to quality healthcare, and integrate health into early childhood development.



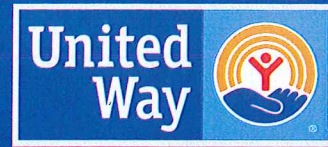

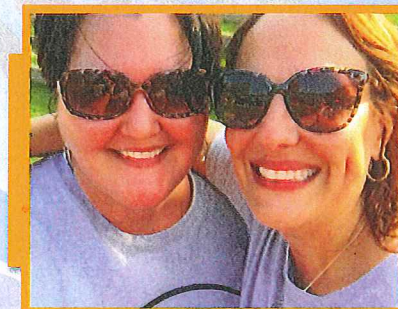
