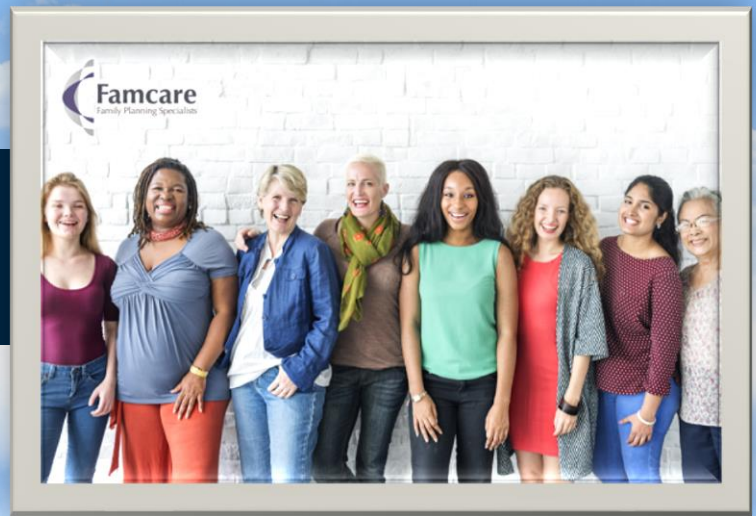


A 2022 Success Story for... Famcare



A 41-year-old woman whose primary language is Spanish made an appointment with us for a medical complaint of irregular bleeding that has been happening for over one year. Famcare has a bilingual Spanish-speaking nurse onsite, who interpreted information between the patient and our clinician. The patient is uninsured and low income (household income of \$450/week) with a family size of six (patient, husband, and four children), placing them at 66% below the Federal Poverty Level. She received a comprehensive well-woman visit that included a thin prep test for cervical cancer, blood pressure check, weight, urinalysis, and Hemocue (test for anemia). Her test for anemia confirmed she was anemic. The clinician prescribed and provided her with iron tablets...Famcare purchases certain medications to have available for low-income and/or uninsured patients so they can receive them when prescribed. The clinician also ordered a pelvic ultrasound to determine if there were uterine fibroids causing the bleeding. The ultrasound was positive for a fibroid but no other abnormality. The clinician provided the patient with medication to manage her bleeding. The patient's ultrasound and follow-up visits at Famcare were covered through funding by United Way of Gloucester County.
