JAIDEN

Jaiden, a 27-year old Gloucester County resident, had been struggling with opioid use disorder since the age of 18. He had attended treatment in the past but had relapsed multiple times. Last year, Jaiden was admitted to Maryville's medically-monitored detox program for a heroin addiction. Prior to entering treatment, Jaiden was involved in a motor vehicle accident when he fell asleep at the wheel due to his drug use. By this time, he had damaged all of his personal relationships, and was on the brink of homelessness.

Upon detox completion, Jaiden transitioned into Maryville's residential treatment component where he received counseling, gained insight about his disease, and was provided with tools and skills to help sustain long-term recovery. At discharge he was enrolled in Maryville's recovery coaching initiative (a partnership with Rowan School of Osteopathic Medicine) which provides in-community support services via a Certified Recovery Support Specialist. Jaiden is also attending outpatient treatment and has been able to maintain his sobriety since discharging from residential treatment several months ago. Jaiden is gainfully employed and working to reestablish his family relationships.
