Danielle, a 26-year-old Gloucester County resident, came to Maryville early in 2019 seeking detox and short term residential services. She was referred by the local Emergency Department after she overdosed on heroin and was treated with Narcan. This had been her 7th overdose.

Danielle had been using heroin and Xanax since the age of 19. She had tried other detoxes and a few IOP treatment programs as well. Most of her treatment episodes had been court ordered, but she stated that this time she was “scared and really wanted to get clean.”

She advised the counseling staff that she had been homeless for six months and had engaged in illegal activities to support herself. She reported having multiple medical issues as well as untreated trauma, anxiety, and depression.

Danielle finished the detox and transferred to short-term. She met with the medical doctor, counselors, and the psychiatric nurse practitioner, and was given medical and mental health treatment. Upon her release, she transferred to a sober living home and eventually an Oxford house. She is currently still at the Oxford house, employed, and slowly reconnecting with her loved ones. She continues to attend outpatient for mental health and substance use treatment.
